Abstract: Perhaps one million citizens of the Argentine Republic have some Anglo-Celtic blood in their veins. Jorge Luis Borges had an English grandmother (he wrote a short story about her adventures as an army wife on the frontier during the Indian wars). Che Guevara's name was actually Guevara Lynch. President Alfonsín's grandmother was Mary Foulkes, a Welsh immigrant. W. H. Hudson was born on an estancia near Quilmes, about 35 kilometres from Buenos Aires. Admiral Brown was

the father of the Argentine navy. General Farrell paved the way for Peron.
