JOHN STUART MILL'S VIEWS ON LIBERTY, CONTESTATION, AND INDIVIDUALITY AND THEIR IMPLICATIONS FOR PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

ABSTRACT

This paper examines John Stuart Mill's essay On Liberty and its implications for public administration. The paper discusses Mill's approaches to posing the (primary) of social justice, his embrace of political and social consensus and of the use of individual self-realization or autonomy, and his argument for the dissemination of political and administrative power. The original text, which at its core is a critique of Mill's argument, has been adapted to provide an alternative view of government that is responsive to the other major political work, Considerations on Representative Government, and also that his recommendations for decentralization in public administration are consistent with American practices of administration.

John Stuart Mill is one of those political thinkers whose ideas are more frequently cited than actually read within public administration. However, a notable exception here is that there is a significant number of people who, in their consideration of Representative Government, have not read Mill's work. It is the author's hope that this work will help to bring the work of this great thinker to the attention of those who are interested in the work of this great thinker.
