### Abstract

This article argues that the short-story cycle should be central to teaching American literature, because the genre crystallizes major tensions of American literary history: marginality and inclusion, the individual and the community, and the formation of a national literature from transnational and local materials.

Few literary myths yield as much influence as that of the great American novel. The idea that a singular work could embody (and export) a sprawling, diverse nation has appealed to authors, critics, and the public imagination. *Moby Dick* (1851), *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* (1885), *The Great Gatsby* (1925), *The Grapes of Wrath* (1939), and *Invisible Man* (1952) are just a few of the novels offered up as contenders for the title by scholars and popular opinion alike. The debate surrounding the censorship of “nigger” from Twain’s novel in 2011 indicates the continued prominence of the dream of the great American novel. As columnists discussed Twain’s treatment of race and racism in the novel, most, including Tom Leonard (2011) in the *Daily Mail* and Patrick Hogan (2011) of the *Gazette*, positioned *Huck Finn* as “a” or “the” great American novel, which often served as the framework for discussing why the change matters in teaching Twain’s opus. Newspaper columnists and cultural commentators regularly evoke the dream of such a novel. In “*The Great Gatsby* and the Great American Novel” Kenneth E. Eble (2011) offers several reasons that the novel deserves the name. In a radio segment for the *Big Read*, sponsored by the National Endowment for the Arts (2006), Richard Rodriguez and Jay Parini call Steinbeck’s *Grapes of Wrath* a/the great American novel. In an article titled “The Great American Novel” (2002), Patrick Giles extols the virtues of Ralph Ellison’s work. These are just a sampling of the recent critical and popular work engaging this ideal. However, many other scholars have long scoffed at the “inanity” (O’Connor 1955: 6) or nationalistic
