Abstract

Much evaluation of teaching focuses on what teachers do in class and the way they affect student learning. This article examines the influence of assessment arrangements on what, how and how often assessment is used. It proposes a set of 'conditions' under which assessment supports learning, based on reference to theory, empirical evidence and practical experience. It offers a framework for teachers to review the effectiveness of their own assessment practices.
