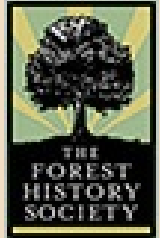

With this book Jacob Hamblin makes a major contribution to our understanding of the decisive role of military priorities and military funding in the shaping of a wide range of environmental sciences. As a contribution to the historiography of science as conditioned by its political, ideological, social, and financial contexts, *Arming Mother Nature* shows how the ideologies and international institutions of the Cold War shaped the rise of fundamental environmental sciences.
