Louis Lesser, a hard-working Jewish bank clerk in the city of Dresden, turned twenty-one in the summer of 1836. His job at the *Wechselcomptoir* of Mendel Schie, the most prominent Jewish banker in Dresden, consumed a large portion of his waking hours. Louis normally worked at the bank all day from Monday to Thursday, until shortly before sundown on Friday, for a few

hours after sunset on Saturday, and for a number of hours on Sunday morning. Yet that still left him with many hours to engage in leisure pursuits – and Louis used those hours to the fullest. Dresden, the prosperous and cultured capital of the kingdom of Saxony, had much to offer a young man, Jewish or otherwise, in search of pleasure or relaxation....
