“An impossible quid pro quo”: Re of Tomás de Torquemada

Abstract

The name Tomás de Torquemada has become synonymous with the Spanish Inquisition, and a symbol of religious fanaticism, hatred of minorities, and even sadism. Throughout the centuries since he was adopted by writers and artists as a representation of cruelty and contemporaries praised him (albeit somewhat carefully), and in favor of his monarchs, Isabel and Ferdinand, after his death he has acquired a nefarious reputation as a fanatical zealot and a torturer, a charge which still lingers today. How did an (admittedly) austere Dominican come to embody and personify the Black Legend? This paper will explore the representations of Tomás de Torquemada, attempting to understand and explain the representations of the man which continue to thrive.
