Armed with an arresting title, this book makes substantial claims to

illuminate major aspects of the modern world from the seventeenth century to the present day. It is organised in fifteen chronologically ordered chapters. It uses a fair representation of recent scholarship to explore its basic premiss that the bourgeoisie, although initially sympathetic to liberal ideas, became less so as the demands of the proletariat increased. Marc Mulholland begins by briefly defining his protagonists, the bourgeoisie and the proletariat, and the structures which he alleges represent them—bourgeois civil society and proletarian democracy. He notes the potential conflict between the bourgeois belief in ‘flexible labour markets’ and the proletariat’s determination to ‘secure wage labour’.

What follows is, I hope, a fair summary of the views of the author. We are plunged first into seventeenth-century absolutism, with a focus on Britain, where, it is...
