Abstract:

This article is a revised version of the introductory paper given at the conference on the Kindertransports held in 2009 at the Institute of Germanic & Romance Studies, University of London. After reviewing certain historical and modern views of the Kindertransports, it sets out in broad outline how the idea of children's transports from the continent and was implemented in practice. It then considers how the children were received in Britain and how they responded to the experience of forced emigration. The tone of the original paper has largely been retained.
