Abstract : Water development projects, necessary for economic growth, displace people from their settlements thereby creating the problem of how to resettle the displaced people. The ultimate objective of the rehabilitation and resettlement programme is to help the displaced people become established and economically self-sustaining in the shortest practical time. To improve on the economic status they had before resettlement, thereby mitigate the suffering. Information was collected on the impact of 2 major irrigation projects in India: the Rengali dam and the Subarnarekha dam. The plights and problems of the oustees, mostly tribal people, were examined. The study covered 264 villages (9044 families) displaced by the Rengali dam and 109 villages (9044 families) displaced by the Subarnarekha dam.
