Abstract : A note on p. 192 explains that this volume, except for some of the figures, was completed for publication in 1946. Volume III as a whole is chiefly concerned with the publication of many new figures which could not be included in Volumes I and II. Part I of Volume III there are no illustrations.

Part I contains some 24 pages of additions and corrections to Volume I, and

II. In Appendix I the author discusses Simpson's " Principles of Classification and in Appendix II (30 pages) he gives notes on the rodents from Madagascar British Museum and on a collection from that island obtained by Mr. C. S. We pages of Addenda, comprising short notes on various points, complete Part an index (on similar lines to those of the earlier volumes) of 18 pages.

Scientists who have used the two earlier volumes as their source of detailed on this enormous subject will need this new publication. It is obviously a real large amount of original and painstaking research on the rodents themselves literature relating to them.
