Abstract

In a single volume, a team of distinguished international scholars apply social science theory to explain the dynamics of bargaining and diplomacy and many issues are involved. Each contributor explores a different approach to successful agreements among diverse governments, multinational corporations, and international actors. To show how these approaches work in action, the book provides detailed analyses of two multilateral negotiations - the General Agreement for Tariffs and Trade (GATT) and the Single European Act consolidating the European Community.

The book provides the tools for analyzing and managing the complexity of negotiations including: How the roots of conflict, the distribution of power, and patterns of resistance and cooperation affect all stages of negotiation; how multi-attribute utility models, and other practical tools can be used to identify strategic trade-offs before negotiations; how negotiators can be trained by applying the rules and culture of organizations to change through experience; how insights into the way small groups function can help advance negotiation; and how modes of leadership are needed to diagnose multinational problems.
