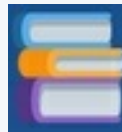

It might be a blue-ribbon panel appointed either by the president, as in the case of the Kerner Commission, or by the president and Congress, as with the 9/11 Commission.¹ The two reports reviewed in this essay were written by the White House and by a bipartisan committee of Congress, respectively.
