Abstract : The primary purpose is to discover why the agrarian reform of the Spanish Republic failed so completely. Because of the overwhelming political and social problems of the agrarian problem, the study is at the same time an examination of the origins of the Spanish Civil War. It is prefaced with a sociological analysis of land tenure and the structure of rural society in Southern Spain which constitutes the first quarter of the book.

Spain is the chief concern of the study, it is considered that the Spanish experience has special relevance to one important aspect of the agrarian problem that agitates the underdeveloped nations today. It is presented that on both the popular and official level, the Western world has developed a singularly uniform ideal as to how the problem should be solved, but few of the great agrarian reforms of the past have followed this pattern and only rarely has major land reform been attempted by constitutional, economically rational procedures within a democratic framework. In the Spanish case, where the initial events followed exactly the pattern prescribed by the Western model for agrarian reform in underdeveloped nations today, stand out as the few historical exceptions. Yet the consequence was not the stabilization of the agrarian system but its destruction. The question is then raised whether the Western model is applicable to the Spanish failure was due to special circumstances, or if democratic land reform is beset by obstacles that are likely to prove insurmountable.
