Photographs of these two types, and excellent pictures of quarter horses and other breeds in action illustrate the great functional diversity which has been developed within the species. The book is essentially one for the horse enthusiast, but it contains a great deal of information about breeds found outside Britain and for this reason will constitute a valuable addition to the literature on horse breeds.
