In Chapters 5 and 6 attention turns to divorce, again focusing first on trends and differentials...and then on an assessment of causes....Polygamy is then discussed in Chapter 7, and in Chapter 8 the effect of changes in marriage and divorce on fertility. Chapter 9 draws the diverse strands together and reaches some conclusions.
