In this historical account of the origins and evolution of UNHCR, the author attempts to identify the major challenges the organization now and in the years ahead. The focus of this study is to examine the extent to which the evolution of the organization has been framed by crucial events of international politics during the past fifty years and how the actions of the prior High Commissioners and the UNHCR have helped shape the course of world history. Each chapter reviews and examines the contribution of an individual High Commissioner to the development of the Office. The history of the last fifty years demonstrates how the organization has initiated and capitalized on international political development to progressively expand its scope and authority. The author makes recommendations aimed at making the agency more effective and accountable.
