Abstract

Many sociolinguistic writings (e.g. Fishman, J. A., 1972. *Language and Nationalism: Two Integrative Essays*. Newbury House, Rowley, MA; Fishman, J. A. 1991. *Reversing Language Shift*. Multilingual Matters, Clevedon; Phillipson, R. and Skutnabb-Kangas, T. 1986. *English: The Language of Wider Colonisation*. Paper presented at the 11th World Congress, New Delhi) assume native language is inherently central to individual identity, so that those members of an ethnic group who natively speak a language particularly associated with that group are more "authentic"™ than those who do not. Though such an ideology is true of many groups and many individuals, it is not true of all groups: some, such as Jews, Greeks, Armenians, overseas Indians, Chinese, etc., define their identity in other ways, according to religion, tradition, and/or ancestry, but not native language. An ideology defining identity in terms of native language will inevitably view groups rejecting this ideology as being deficient, low on the "authenticity hierarchy"™ established by this ideology, deceptively speaking "other peoples'"™ languages, and nervously and insistently claiming distinctive identities

peoples at æ™™ languages, and perversely and insistently claiming distinctive identities and interests. It is just such an understanding of the alleged æ™™ naturalæ™™™ connection between language and identity which was at the heart of the development of Nazi antisemitism, the view that Jews were impure, deceptive, and not normal human beings.
