

Abstract

Marshall University has a long and unique history, but perhaps the custom of the institution rests in its furry friend, Marco, the mascot nicknamed the 'Big Green'. Marshall's idea of a mascot did not originate until 1900. The term was coined by the Huntington sportswriter Duke Ridgley. Later in the same year, football coach Charles 'Trusty' Tallman led the team to its first win of the season. Headlines everywhere read 'Trusty Tallman Leads the Team to Victory'. The headlines, along with Zane Grey's hit novel *The Thunderbolt*, led to the term within the community. As such, Marshall needed a mascot to lead a herd. Thus, the idea of a strong mascot was born.
