Abstract

Culture of Reclamation (Armstrong, Lutze, & Woodworth-Ney) is a sequence of "videopoems" about Idaho, integrating poetry, history, music and videography in a video presentation, which also includes the work of three Idaho scholars in the fields of history, literacy education and the arts: the historian (Laura), poet (Jamie), and videographer (Peter)—a cross-disciplinary project to reclaim a portion of the history of an engaging medium. Culture of Reclamation expresses a response to the early irrigated settlement communities along the Snake and Boise Rivers. In 1862 and 1890, a land rush to the arid western United States occurred as the federal government built irrigation projects to reclaim the farmland.
