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Abstract:

This article aims to explore the failure of Congregationalism in Dublin. It concludes that Dublin Congregationalism was 'guilt by association' with the Protestant Reformation and the domination of Ireland by a 'foreign power'. Initial Congregationalism grew not by force of arms but from the 18th Century Evangelical Revival, and its churches were influential. However, military conflicts (1914-1922) had a traumatic impact upon surviving Dublin Congregationalism. This impact was accentuated by the theocratic nature of the Free State Governments (1922- 1938), which reduced Protestant feeling 'strangers in their own land'. Therefore Congregationalism in Dublin failed because its theology, doctrine, worship and democratic fellowship ran in contrast to the hierarchical and authoritarian nature of other faiths, and it had no indigenous roots.
