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Sex in America: a definitive survey.

Abstract: This book is one of a pair published simultaneously to present results from the same study to two different audiences. This book was written to inform a wide audience about sexual behavior, both public and private. The goal of the book was to place America's sexual practices in a context which helps explain not only what Americans do, but why. Knowing the reasons for various behaviors allows people to decide whether or not they want to change their own behavior, and, if so, what might make such change possible. After an introductory chapter on sex in America, the book proceeds with a chapter describing the survey used to gain the data. The third chapter considers the identity of sex partners, the fourth discusses finding a partner. In the fifth chapter, the question of how many sex partners Americans have is explored. Chapter 6 provides information on how often Americans engage in sexual intercourse. Chapter 7 outlines sex practices and preferences, chapter 8 presents survey results on masturbation and erotica. The ninth chapter covers homosexual partners. Chapter 10 deals with sexually transmitted diseases, and Chapter 11 with AIDS. The twelfth chapter discusses the various manifestations of forced sex (which extend beyond the old definition of rape). The final chapter deals with sex and society. The book also has two appendices, which provide a graphic representation of the survey respondents and the sex questionnaire which was used.
