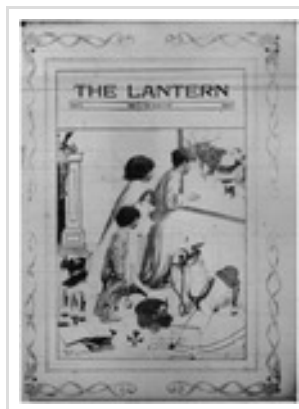

Historical Note

The Lantern was a semi-weekly newspaper published in Chester, S.C. It was established in 1908 and its proprietor was J. T. Biggs. Other owners included Dana Jones, J. Otis Hull, C. W. Pegram. The successor to the newspaper was the Chester News. In 1918 a new number sequence. In 1920 the newspaper was published weekly.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of 12 issues of the newspaper published in Chester, South Carolina from 1908 to 1908. The newspaper was scanned from microfilm, is available in digital format.

Additional Notes

The microfilm of The Lantern was made under a special agreement, the Pettus Archives. The newspapers were in poor condition and were a relatively poor digital copy.

Provenance

The microfilm of the newspaper was made by the University of North Carolina and was scanned by the Library of Congress University in 2014.
