



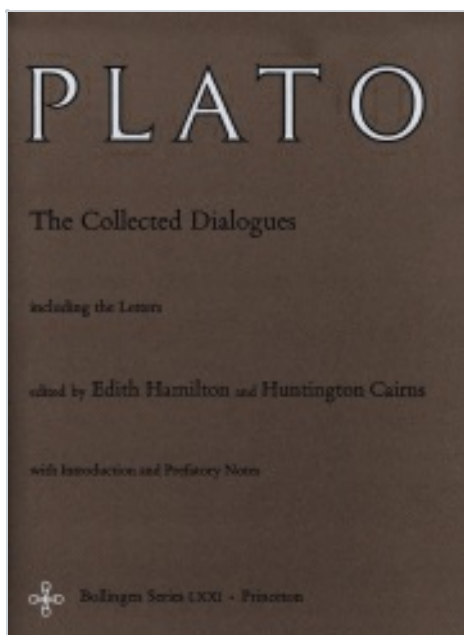

SUMMARY
