Chapter Summary

The curious custom of recycling medieval Hebrew and non-Hebrew manuscript parchment folios during the second half of the seventeenth century, and in some cases up to the eighteenth century, is well known to scholars working in the field of book production or in that of medieval Hebrew manuscripts. The 385 volumes we found in the Biblioteca Estense in Modena are a good example of this practice: in most cases they have a standard binding, with ribs in half-skin incised, and the handwritten folios were recycled after erasing the Hebrew text. This chapter formulates two questions: (1) How did so many Hebrew manuscripts come to be bound in printed books? (2) What does this impressive quantity of fragments contain?.
